The Scholarship Report

What You Need to Know About OSAP



When students decide to attend a postsecondary institution, the <u>Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP)</u> helps them pay for college or university in the form of grants (free money) and / or loans. Here is a summary of what you should know about OSAP:

Tuition is now free for those earning up to \$90,000. Students from families who earn up to \$175,000 are also eligible for financial aid. Almost all students who receive OSAP get some or all of their funding as a grant — money they will never have to pay back.

You can check the estimated tuition costs and find out how much money you may receive in grants and loans here. Find out if your school is approved for OSAP here.

Open a bank account in your name if you do not have one already. You will need one if applying to OSAP.

When you apply for OSAP, you are automatically considered for both loans and grants! But did you know that you can decline the loan and request the grant only? One way to do this is by selecting the *No Loan Option* on your application funding summary. Also, note the conditions why your grant can be turned into a loan!

Students with specific needs – students with disabilities, Indigenous students, Crown wards, first-generation students, students who are dead or hard of hearing, students on social assistance -- may be eligible for additional OSAP funds depending on their circumstances.

Savings in an RESP for college or university no longer count against the money a student can receive from OSAP.

OSAP funds are **NOT** directed to your school (although you CAN direct them there on your application); they are deposited directly into your bank account.

Apply for OSAP (the Ontario Student Assistance Program) as early as possible. This will ensure that the funds are available to you when you begin school. The OSAP deadline for application submission is "no later than 60 days before the end of your study period."

You MUST notify your financial aid office at your school if the information on your loan application has changed (e.g. if you make more/less in the summer than expected). This includes any awards, bursaries, or scholarships you receive. Your funding may be impacted.

You can request a <u>funding review</u> if you have not received the amount you believe you need. Fulltime students must request a review no later than 40 days before the end of the study period.

Single students will not have to start repaying the Ontario portion of their student loans until they are earning a minimum of \$35,000 a year.

SCHOLARSHIP TIPS

Did you know the majority of scholarship application deadlines are from January to JUNE? Keep on researching and applying for scholarships and bursaries!!

If a scholarship application states that you must be enrolled in postsecondary education in order to apply, but you have not received confirmation of acceptance as yet, apply for the scholarships anyway and explain that you will send your confirmation of enrolment upon acceptance.

College (ontariocolleges.ca) May 1, 2018: Deadline to confirm Offers of Admission

Colleges may extend offers of admission after this date. Each college will set the deadline to confirm offers made after May 1, and this deadline will be communicated to you with your offer.

Mid-June 2018: Tuition Deposit due at the Colleges

The tuition deposit secures your spot in your program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college.

University (OUAC)

May 29, 2018: The latest date you can expect the following responses from an Ontario university: an offer of admission; a refusal; or a deferral, pending additional information.

June 1, 2018: The earliest date you may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.).

University of Toronto's Department of Philosophy The Aristotle: a high school philosophy essay contest

Anyone enrolled in a Canadian high school, or home schooled, at or below the Grade 12 level (or equivalent) may participate in the Aristotle Contest. Submissions in both English and French are welcome.

Award: 1st prize: \$500 Submission deadline: May 25, 2018

TO-DO LIST



- Check your email daily. Many universities and colleges use email to keep you informed of financial aid, admissions info, and student awards. Also check out the Student Financial Services page on the university or college website for information on scholarships and bursaries.
- Submit any optional forms that may increase your chances of getting into a school. Many universities provide an opportunity for you to support your admission application. Factors that have negatively affected a student's academic performance, such as illness or personal problems, are also considered. See <u>University of Guelph</u> and <u>Wilfrid Laurier</u> <u>University</u> for examples of ways to support your application.
- Consider your school options carefully. Book a tour of the school campus if you haven't already attended an Open House. Exploring the campus will help you to decide if the school is a good fit for you! Consider the financial aid package you may have been offered as well as the cost of travel / living expenses if attending a school out of town.
- Keep track of deadlines for registration deposit, residence application and deposit, tuition deposit, supporting documentation, and OSAP deadlines.

Ecampus Ontario has free or low-cost textbooks that students can view (no cost) and/or download (no cost) or print (low-cost) to use in their courses.
